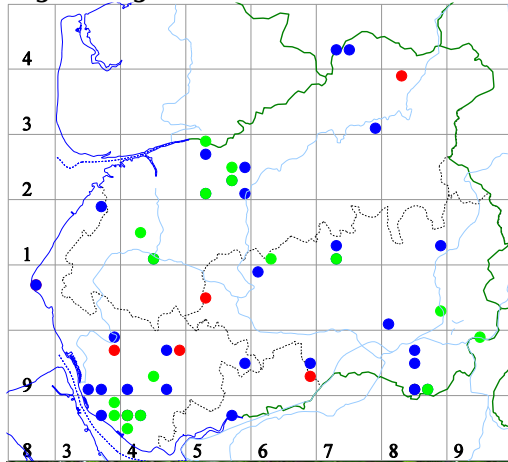

Status & distribution: Archaeophyte-cultivated; widely scattered planted trees. There is a record limited to 10km precision for SD62.

Earliest record traced: Roadside near Didisbury College (SJ89K, Grindon 1859).

Habitat: Ornamental woods, parks, isolated trees in fields.

Comments: Native to south-eastern Europe and Asia.

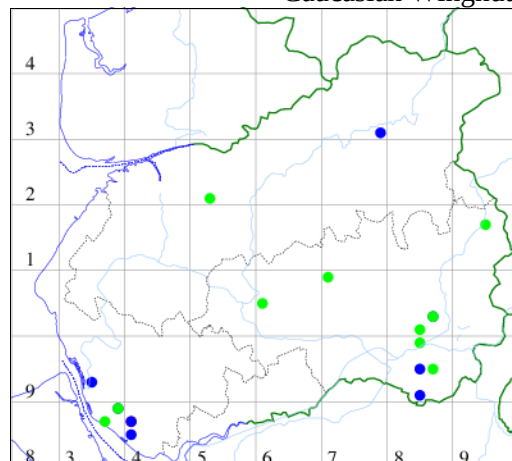

Status & distribution: Neophyte, planted; Reynolds Park, Woolton (SJ4287, S Marley & SJ McWilliam, 2019).

Comments: Native to North America.

Calderstones Park, S Marley 2020

Status & distribution: Neophyte-planted and surviving.

Earliest record traced: Calderstones Park, (SJ4087, AM & VH, 1988).

Habitat: In parks, tree planting schemes, along urban canal sides and more rarely as a street tree.

Comments: Native to the Caucasus.

Hybrid Wingnut

Status & distribution: Neophyte-planted and surviving; Calderstones Park (SJ4097, R Duffy, 2017).

Comments: Of horticultural origin. Some of the records for *Pterocarya fraxinifolia* may belong here.
