
RUPPIACEAE Tasselweed family



Southport J Somerville 2008

Status & distribution: Native, Nationally Uncommon, Near Threatened (Red List for England); Rare (2), occurs at an old drainage channel, Birkdale Green Beach (SD3015) and in some abundance in the Marine Lake, Southport (SD3317, SD3318 & SD3418).

Former distribution: Bootle (SJ39H, RA Tudor, -1839); near Abram (SD60A, V Gordon, 1992, LIV); Worsley Brook, Eccles (SJ79N, F Bentley, n.d. det. JE Dandy).

Habitat: Coastal marine lakes, brackish

ditches and pools.

Comments: The two inland records from assumed non-saline habitats are most intriguing.
