
APOCYNACEAE Periwinkle family




Weld Road, Birkdale DP Earl 2008 **Status & distribution:** Neophytenaturalised; widespread as a garden escape and planted for ground cover.

Earliest record traced: Rainscough Brow (SD80B, G Caley, 1801).

Habitat: Woods, hedgebanks, roadsides, railway banks, abandoned gardens and waste ground often near habitation.

Comments: Native to mainland Europe.





Prescot DP Earl 2008

Litherland DP Earl 2019 **Status & distribution:** Neophyte-naturalised; a frequent garden escape especially in the west along the coast fringe.

Earliest record traced: Knowsley (*SJ49H*, PA Jones, 1946).

Habitat: Dune margins, woods, hedgebanks, roadsides, railway banks and waste ground often near habitation.

Comments: Native to the Mediterranean region. Most plants are var. major with var. oxyloba being recorded from Water Street, Chorley (SD5817, DP & J Earl, 2012) & Colne (SD9040, H Beck, 2019). The variegated form is also widely naturalised.
