

Water-starwort family





Status & distribution: Native, Least Concern (Red List for England); **Habitat:** Ditches, ponds, canals, reservoirs, mill lodges, streams, shallow pools, on exposed mud, cattle trod wet ground, moorland flushes and pools. **Comments:** There are some edits to data to be carried out for this genus and the creation of revised maps (as for Callitriche brutia Petagna ssp. hamulata) as a consquence of taxonomic revisions.

Callitriche hermaphroditica L.




Status & distribution: Native, Least Concern (Red List for England), Axiophyte; there are post 1994 records from Upton Rocks (SJ58D, J Guest, 1998); High Rid Reservoir (SD61Q, J Lowell, 1998); Withnell Fold Nature Reserve (SD62, D Bentley, 1995). **Habitat:** Reservoirs and mill lodges;

formerly, canals and springs.

Comments: Plants may still occur at some of the historic locations; this species has possibly been overlooked in recent times.

Callitriche stagnalis Scop.




Status & distribution: Native, Least Concern (Red List for England); generally common wherever suitable habitats exist, although scarce in the most urban areas.

Habitat: Ditches, ponds, canals, reservoirs, streams, shallow pools, on exposed mud, cattle trod wet ground, moorland flushes and pools.


Comments: Although Water-starwort is often recorded as Callitriche agg. or C.

stagnalis s.l. it is thought that C. stagnalis s.s. is the most commonly occurring species of the genus – see map below.

Various-leaved Water-starwort



Status & distribution: Native. Least Concern (Red List for England), Axiophyte; possibly widespread with a number of recent records mainly by D Bentley from pond surveys.

Habitat: Ditches, marl pits and mill lodges.

Comments: The *Greenlees & Holden* (1920) records from the Bolton area for C. palustris possibly relate to this species.

Callitriche obtusangula Le Gall

Blunt-fruited Water-starwort 3 2

Status & distribution: Native, Least Concern (Red List for England); Scarce (3) and declining at lower altitudes, mainly on the coastal plain, there are post 1994 records from Rimrose Valley (SJ39J, V Gordon, 1995); in a marl-pit near Gregson Lane (SD52Y, J Guest, 1995); Altcar Rifle Range (SD2910, PH Smith, 2016).

Habitat: Ponds, ditches and canals.

Callitriche brutia Petagna ssp. brutia Pedunculate Water-starwort



Status & distribution: Native, Least Concern (Red List for England), Axiophyte; widely distributed but occasional.

Habitat: Ponds, pools, mill lodges and reservoirs.

Comments: Thought to be first recorded as C. intermedia var. pedunculata from Ashton Moss (SJ99E, Flora of Ashton 1888); probably under-recorded.

Callitriche brutia Petagna ssp. *hamulata* (Kütz. ex W.D.J. Koch) O. Bolòs & Vigo



Status & distribution: Native, Least Concern (Red List for England), Axiophyte; local in the lowlands, most frequent in the hill districts.

Habitat: In ponds, marl pits, ditches, canals, reservoirs and mill lodges and moorland streams.

Comments: The var. *homoiophylla* Gre. & Godr. was recorded from Rivington Moor, Belmont (JD Massey, 1938).
