
## **ALISMATACEAE**


Water-plantain family

**Status & distribution:** Native, Least Concern (Red List for England); Axiophyte, widespread, frequent to locally common and clearly strongly linked to the canal network.

**Habitat:** Canals, rivers and ponds. **Comment:** Populations have fluctuated and declined with dredging activity and the intensive use of the canals by pleasure craft, but overall, there has been a marked increase in species distribution for several decades along the canal network.




Longton DP Earl 2010

Status & distribution: Neophyte-naturalised; Longton Brickcroft (SD4725, DP & J Earl & FE Ford, 2010); Severn Acre Park (SD7309 & SD7310, I Boote, 2010); Old School House, Parbold (SD4910, B Deed, 2014); Round Clump, Halsnead Park, Whiston (SJ4690, S McWilliam, 2016); Three Sisters, Eccles (SJ7699, DP & J Earl, 2020); Laffak Road, St Helens (SJ5297, r\_i\_k, 2021)

Habitat: Ponds.

**Comments:** Native to North America.

Baldellia ranunculoides (L.) Parl. ssp. ranunculoides Lesser Water-plantain




Status & distribution: Native,

Vulnerable (Red List for England); Scarce and declining localised populations along the Sefton coast; probably extinct inland.

Former distribution: Once more widespread on the costal plain; Hale (SJ48R, Green 1902); last recorded inland at the Risley Royal Ordnance Factory site (SJ6591, D Nash, 1977).

Habitat: On damp open sand at duneslacks, silted pond margins and in ditches.


Luronium natans (L.) Raf.

**Status & distribution:** Native, Nationally Scarce, Near Threatened (Red List for England); Axiophyte, occasional to locally common along the canals of Greater Manchester, very rare elsewhere in a dyke near a sand pit, Martin Mere (SD41H, Anon., 1969); Lower Moor (SD92C, V Gordon & PS Gateley, 1996) & in a pond at Troy Quarry (SD7623, P Jepson, 2005). Earliest record traced: A canal between Manchester & Macclesfield (Adamson Botanical Exchange Club Report 1916). **Habitat:** Canals, ponds and ditches. **Comments:** The populations along the reopened Rochdale Canal initially declined but are steadily recovering but have yet to reach the former levels of abundance.

Alisma plantago-aquatica L.




Status & distribution: Native, Least Concern (Red List for England); generally widespread at lower altitudes, very local to absent in upland areas.

Habitat: Ponds, riverbanks, and ditches, locally common along the canals.

**Comments:** Possibly under-recorded in

some rural lowland districts.

## Alisma lanceolatum With.



Status & distribution: Native, Least Concern (Red List for England); Scarce (10), most post 1994 records are from the Leeds & Liverpool Canal between Withnell Fold (SD6123) and Knott's Bridge, Hapton (SD8032) with records elsewhere from Liverpool Festival Garden Site (SJ38T) & River Alt, near Woodfall Hall (SJ4392 & SJ4393, LIV) V Gordon, 1997; Arran Trail Ponds, Blackburn (SD7126, P Jepson, 2003); Yarrow Country Park (SD5715, C Winder, 2008); Parsonage Reservoir (SD7031, P Jepson & SJ Gorman, 2010); ditches north of Shirdley Hill (SD3613, S Bowden, 2017). **Habitat:** Canals, ponds and slow-flowing rivers; formerly recorded from dune-slacks and ditches.

**Comments:** Considered to be declining and in some cases possibly confused with narrow leaved forms of *Alisma plantago-aquatica*.
